There were a few large rocks but most of them could be rolled up and didn't require a lot of formal technique.

It was a great event for me. I won the Sportsman A class with a respectable score of 27. Blake Laney, my competition for the year, came in second. He had beaten me at Meriden. The differences in

our riding abilities should make us great competition for each other this year. He has the skills for larger obstacles and I've really gotten good at making tight turns. We each have our strengths and it will be interesting to see how they come into play throughout this riding season.

Coming up quickly on June 11th is the Springfield Motorcycle Club event held in Brimfield, Massachusetts. Many people have been working hard to put together a great event! It was one of my favorites last year and I look forward to riding there again! Awards for this year's event will be medals like the ones given out last year. Rhode Island was founded in 1636. The first circus in the United States was held in Newport, RI in 1774. Rhode Island is also home of the oldest operating tavern in the United States, The White Horse Tavern was built in 1673, it has been serving guests for over 350 years! To trials riders, Rhode Island is best known for its amazing events. Rhode Island Trials Club is New England's largest trials club and was founded in 1994. Over the years they've held NETA events, National Championship events, and even FIM World Championship Trials events!

With the NATC Nationals coming up, many people will be traveling to Rhode Island in July. If you're looking for a nice place to stay, Oak Embers Campground is a top choice for many Rhode Island Trials Club visitors. It's located conveniently close to the event and has many tent and RV sites. They do fill up quickly so book your site soon!

If you don't mind traveling a little further Whispering Pines Campground is another great option! They have tent and RV sites as well as cabins. Whispering Pines Campground offers many family activities and is having a Christmas in July weekend July 28th-29th. They offer plenty of things to keep the whole family entertained. There is a rec center and arcade. They also have horse shoes, mini golf, bocce ball, corn hole, basketball and more!

If you prefer a more quiet place to spend your weekend, Hickory Ridge Family Campground might be the place. It's in a beautiful wooded area and has a 2 acre spring fed pond perfect for fishing, kayaking, and canoeing. Best of all it's only a short drive from the Rhode Island Trials Club.

If you're looking for something to do while in Rhode Island there are plenty of great attractions! The Tomaquag Museum in Exeter is one of the oldest tribal museums in the country! The museum is dedicated to educating people about indigenous history, culture, and arts. They are open to the public on Wednesdays and Saturdays.

If you love animals you'll want to check out the Roger Williams Park Zoo. It's just over half an hour from RITC, but is worth the visit! Since 1872 the zoo has been educating people on wildlife. Located on 40 acres of woodlands, they have over 160 species of animals! At the zoo you'll see well known creatures like cheetahs and elephants, and even more exotic creatures like the Binturong. If you plan to visit the zoo in July they will also have the Dinosaurs Among Us attraction open, which offers guests the chance to get up close to nearly 60 life-size animatronic and interactive dinosaurs.

If you're looking for places to eat, there are many nice restaurants in the area! I don't have any personal experience with any food places in the area, but after looking at reviews, pictures, and menus online, Dan's Place is at the top of my list! Their menu is extensive and they offer many gluten free options. They offer pizza, burgers, grinders, pasta dishes, ribs and more! With well over 150 items on their menu, you are sure to find something you like!

If you're overwhelmed by all the options, Back 40 might be the place to go! They've got classics like Chicken Parm and Burgers, as well as some unusual twists like Parmesan Truffle Fries. Although their menu isn't huge, they've got some great options. People online have said that the waitresses are friendly and fantastic!

The homestead restaurant has been around for over 29 years! It's a nice rustic looking place with an extensive menu. They have appetizers, soups, salads, burgers, and sandwiches. They also offer chicken, pork, steak, and seafood. There is sure to be something for everyone! Open for lunch and dinner Tuesday-Sunday.
